Ann Catherine Morrissey, 69, Topeka, passed away at Midland Hospice House Thursday, February 16, 2006.

Ann was born September 24, 1936 in Holton, the daughter of the late Joseph and Mary Colvin Morrissey. She graduated from Hayden High School and attended Washburn University. She worked at Kaw Valley State Bank and Trust as operations officer for over 35 years. Ann was the first woman bank officer in Topeka.
