Bob Gene McCullough passed away on Wednesday, May 25, 2005.

Bob was born on February 24, 1927, at his family's home in Burlington, Kansas, to Grover Cleveland McCullough and Nellie Mabel Kelley McCullough. He graduated from Burlington High School. He was an Army veteran of World War II and also served in the Kansas National Guard for many years.

Bob worked as a lineman for the Coffey County Rural Electric Cooperative after his Army service. He later worked as an Engineer Technician in Field Survey and Road Design with the Kansas Department of Transportation and retired from KDOT in 1990 after 37 years of service.

He married Barbara Jean Pierce on May 14, 1955 in Burlington, Kansas. She survives.

Bob was a member of the Optimist Club and American Legion Post #1. He had a great sense of humor, and loved to fish. He loved his cat Bubba, and all animals. He was a patient, loving father and grandfather.

Bob is also survived by his son, Martin McCullough and his wife Llaina, and granddaughter Amanda of Topeka; his daughter, Pam Fleck, and her

husband, Terry, and granddaughters Bethany, Kylie and Cassidy Fleck of Topeka; and daughter Mindy Mcdaniel, of Topeka; a brother, Kenneth McCullough, and his wife, Joye; and nephew, Roger McCullough, all of Topeka. He was preceded in death by six brothers and sisters, and two half – sisters.

He leaves behind many friends he made during his life, particularly his friends and co-workers at KDOT. Services will be at 11 a.m. Tuesday, May 31, at Kevin Brennan Family Funeral Home. Burial will be at 1:30 p.m. in Graceland Cemetery, Burlington, Kansas.
