“ My younger brother Brian was his own man and lived his own life. At times, he seemingly sought out controversy and trouble, but I think that is what can occur when you are real, authentic, and certainly stubborn. He wasn't fake and wouldn't hide behind anything or anyone. You would never hear him say “I don't want to offend anyone / I don't want anyone's feelings to get hurt”. If asked a question – he would answer with honesty straight from his heart and sometimes he didn't even have to be asked a question. He was a protector. There are many examples of this in his life, and I was one of the protected on several occasions. From youngsters to his last day, he and I gave each other space and were respective of each other's privacy (meaning we didn't see each other as much as I now wish we had) but he never ignored a request to help our dad, me, or my kids. The humane society doesn't care for animals better than my brother cared for his dogs. Did I mention he was his own man and lived his own life - take it or leave it? He could accept that and expected others to as well. He had a large friend group that loved him dearly. Brian hit his stride over the past few years, and I literally thank God for the peace and happiness he found. I loved my brother, and he loved me and his entire family. I will miss him always. I know that he and mom have already made a “beeline” toward each other for a big hug and she is proud to see the good man standing before her.

“ My first memories of my brother Brian were tagging along on a hike, fishing or hunting. Because he was just a few years older than me he made sure I didn't fall behind, and he was always teaching me something. We fished and hunted anything in season. He loved shooting quail and pheasant.

When we were very young, elementary school age, we would sit on the banks of the Shunga Nunga and catch bull heads and snapping turtles. On Saturday mornings the neighborhood kids would head to West Lake at Gage Park and catch carp and catfish with a bunch of other kids around town. One year Brian won the grand prize, a Polaroid Instamatic camera, by catching the biggest fish of the tournament on my rod and reel during Derby Day, the last day of the season. He was so proud, but I knew he also felt a little guilty because it was my rod.

As we grew older and could travel further we would fish farm ponds and routinely sneak below Sherwood Lake dam, or up on the dam, and catch crappie during the spawn. Brian was better at fishing than most. I have a wonderful memory of him catching trout in Bennet Springs on a freezing day, standing in the water, in shorts, turning blue, alone because all the other fisherman were in their vehicles trying to stay warm. Brian was totally focused and catching fish when none of us could.

Brian and I took a few classes at Washburn together. Two that stand out were Speech and College Algebra. He rarely attended class because he worked late hours and often slept in but he was the best speaker in the class and breezed through Algebra as well. Our lives rarely connected back then, so I enjoyed it when he showed up to class.

Brian was smart. He also got bored easy and school couldn't hold his attention. There were no cell phones back then, no instant gratification - you had to make your own fun. We made a lot of it.

Brian always had my back. Since the time we were toddlers he was one of an army of siblings and neighborhood kids who looked out for me. I never forgot that feeling and try to pass it on to my friends and family today.

As time passed and I had a family of my own, Brian made time for us. He helped us when we needed it, finishing the basement of our home in Pittsburg, visiting us in Ulysses to hunt and spend a holiday, and we usually visited for an hour or two when I traveled to Topeka for work. He ended all of our phone calls by saying, "Give Jenni and the kids a hug and a kiss from me and tell them I love them!" He was a great uncle to Jacqueline and Charlie.

I was blessed with four siblings, each as unique as the planets in the heavens. We wouldn't be the family we are without Brian. I will remember him laughing, cooking, telling stories, boasting about his daughters and grandkids and his siblings — all the while, searching to understand what it all means and where he fit into it. He loved his dogs, his kids, and his grandchildren. He loved his parents, siblings and friends - and I am so fortunate to have had him as my brother.

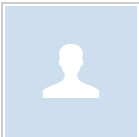
