Bridget Jeanette Kelly Moore, 85, Topeka, Kansas, died Tuesday, January 7, 2020, at the House at Midland Care.

Bridget was born August 1, 1934, in the family farmhouse in Ogden, Kansas, to Willard and Marguerite Weaver Kelly. She attended Sacred Heart Academy and graduated from Luckey High School in Manhattan, Kansas. On September 5, 1953, Bridget and M. Neil Moore were married, enjoying more than 28 years together prior to his death May 22, 1982.

Bridget was a member of Most Pure Heart of Mary Church volunteering in the grade school lunch program and for Hayden PACE. She worked in operations for Merchants National Bank in Topeka and in Kansas City. Bridget enjoyed playing bridge calling it the best game ever.
