



## Chester J. Kazminski

December 22, 1924 - March 14, 2006

Chester Joseph Kazminski, 81, Topeka, died Tuesday, March 14, 2006 at Midland Hospice House.

Mr. Kazminski was born December 22, 1924 in Chicago, the son of the late Joseph and Helen (Klafke) Kazminski. He enlisted in the US Marines at the age of 17 immediately following the bombing of Pearl Harbor and served on an aircraft carrier in the south Pacific. Following WWII Chester enlisted in the Air National Guard in Chicago. A short time later he enlisted in the US Air Force where he finished his military career, retiring in 1970.

On April 1, 1970, Chester and Agnes Sutter were married in Switzerland. She survives at the home. The Kazminskis were members of St. Aloysius Catholic Church, Meriden for 30 years and are currently members of Christ the King Church in Topeka.

Other survivors include his son, Rick Kazminski, and his wife, Lori, and their children, Kelly and Sabrina, Huntley IL; and his son Barry Kazminski, and his children, Jay and Maria, Elgin IL. He was preceded in death by his brother, Roman, and his sister, Florence.

Mr. Kazminski will lie in state and family will greet friends from 5 to 6 p.m. Sunday at Kevin Brennan Family Funeral Home, 2801 SW Urish Rd, Topeka

KS 66614. A prayer service will follow at 6 p.m. at the funeral home. Mass of Resurrection will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Monday at St. Aloysius Church, Meriden. Cremation will follow with private inurnment at a later date.
