Christopher James Davis, 39, Topeka, died at his home Thursday, August 5, 2004.

Chris was born May 21, 1965 in Parsons, Kansas to Frank M. Davis, Sr. and Eileen Matzek Davis. He attended Sacred Heart Grade School and graduated from Hayden High School in 1983. Chris was a member of the Knights of Columbus #2608. He served five years in the U.S. Air Force including a tour of duty in Korea. He has continued to serve his country as a Tech Sergeant in the 190th Air Refueling Wing of the Kansas Air National Guard. He was also a civilian employee of that group.

He married Rosa Alvizo; they later divorced.
