



## Clarence Schreiner

January 1, 1928 - July 26, 2010

Clarence Alvin Schreiner, 81, Topeka, passed away Thurs., July 22, 2010. Mr. Schreiner was born Dec. 16, 1928 in Tasco KS, the son of Lawrence and Mary Wasinger Schreiner. He lived most of his life in Topeka where he and his brother, LeeRoy, owned and operated Schreiner Brothers Construction Co. for over 30 years. On April 10, 1950, Clarence married Jacqueline Marie Wagoner at Assumption Catholic Church. They enjoyed 49 years together. She preceded him in death Oct. 27, 1999. Mr. Schreiner was a member of Most Pure Heart of Mary Church, Knights of Columbus, American Legion, the Eagle Lodge and the Moose Lodge. After retirement, he indulged his hobby of woodworking, making beautiful benches and plaques. Survivors include his daughter, Terri Lammers and her husband, Bill; his brothers, LeeRoy Schreiner, Topeka and Donald Schreiner, Florida; and nieces and nephews. He was also preceded in death by his sister Virginia Reis.
