Clement William "Bill" Hochard, 90, Topeka, Kansas, passed away Sunday, February 9, 2020.

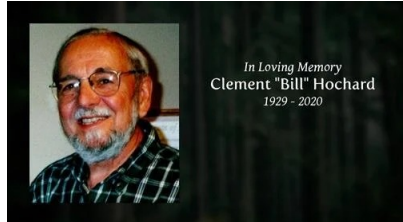
