Cloyd Metzler, 93, Topeka, Kansas, passed away on Wednesday, October 23, 2024. He was born August 23, 1931, to Clyde and Hildred Metzler in Colby, Kansas.

Cloyd lost his mother at the age of five and his father later married Iva Metzler. Iva became the only mother he remembered. Cloyd graduated from the Colby school system and went to work for Southwestern Bell while still in high school. He worked until drafted into the United States Army during the Korean Conflict and served in Korea. After Cloyd was discharged, he returned to Southwestern Bell until retirement in 1991, after a long and satisfying career.

Cloyd was a sports enthusiast, both as a participant and observer, but most of all he enjoyed the Fellowship.

Cloyd is survived by his wife and best friend, Betty Metzler; three children from a previous marriage, Clyde "CC" Metzler, Lori Metzler and Susan Winchell (Robert).

Cloyd lived a good life and will be laid to rest in Beulah Cemetery in Colby, Kansas in a private ceremony.
