Dale L. Miller, 85, Topeka, passed away Saturday, December 12, 2015, at his home.

Dale was born March 24, 1930, at Wamego, Kansas, the son of Pete and Ruth (Hupe) Miller. Dale attended St. George School. He married JoAnn Glotzbach on October 24, 1953, at Sacred Heart Church, Newbury (Paxico) and they recently celebrated their 62nd anniversary. They lived 50 years in the Manhattan, Flush and St. George area. They moved to Topeka in 2003.

Dale was a member of Plumbers and Pipefitters Local #441 (former locals 609 and 165) for over 50 years. He worked for Mosler Safe Company for 11 years. He also owned Miller Plumbing and Heating for several years. Dale was a founding member of Mother Teresa of Calcutta Catholic Church.

Dale is survived by his wife, JoAnn; a son, Glenn Miller and wife, Mickie, KCKS; two daughters, Jeanette Ubel, St. Robert MO, and Patricia Klos and husband, Steve, of Washington state; 11 grandchildren; 19 great-grandchildren and three step-great-grandchildren; a sister, Donis Porter and husband, Phil, of Loveland CO; sister-in-law, Edith Sack of St. Marys KS; and two brothers-in-law, Dennis Glotzbach and wife, Ruby, Topeka and Jack Meredith of California.

A parish rosary will be prayed at 5 p.m. Tuesday at Mother Teresa of Calcutta Church with visitation to follow until 7 p.m.

Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Wednesday at the Church. Burial will take place at 1:30 p.m. at Sacred Heart Cemetery, Newbury (Paxico) KS.

Lo and behold, we have 13 acres of secluded wilderness timber in the Western part of Kansas City, KS. Our place has a spring that flows down from the top of the hill and into a creek!
