



Deacon Don Kostecki

March 24, 1941 - March 11, 2005

Deacon Donald Francis Kostecki, 63, of Topeka and San Ignacio, Belize, was shot and killed March 11, 2005.

Don was born March 24, 1941 in St. Louis. He earned his B.S. in Professional Meteorology from St. Louis University and his M.S. in Water Resources Science from the University of Kansas. He was ordained as a deacon on July 31, 2004 in Sacred Heart Parish, San Ignacio, Belize, Central America.

From 1962-64 he was a weather observer/pilot briefer with the National Weather Service. After graduating from St. Louis U. he went down to Belize as a Papal Volunteer and taught secondary school for two years. From 1966-68 he was a graduate teaching assistant at KU in the Dept. of Geography. He worked as a hydrologist/meteorologist with Kansas Water Resources Board and then with the KS Dept. of Transportation. He was then a water structures hydrologist/environmental scientist with the KS Dept. of Agriculture until 2001 where he retired from. After retirement he worked as a disaster assistance employee with FEMA until 2004. From then until his death, Don taught theology at Sacred Heart Junior College in San Ignacio and served as a deacon for the parish of Sacred Heart and surrounding villages. In San Ignacio he was a member of the Full Gospel Businessmen, and something very close to his heart, was the Faith and Justice Commission which he was heading.

In November of 1968, Don and Netti Figueroa were married. She survives along with her children, Anthony Kostecki, Fort Worth, Alicia Kostecki and her husband, Robert Schlachter, Chicago, Aaron Kostecki, New Orleans, Adrienne Kostecki, Topeka, and Adam Kostecki, Lawrence.

Don was cremated in Belize. A wake and mass was held, and a portion of his remains was encased in a memorial built for him, on the grounds of Sacred Heart Church in San Ignacio.

In Topeka, a memorial Mass will be celebrated at 11:00 a.m. Saturday, Apr. 9, at St. Matthews Church 2700 SE Virginia. Family will greet friends one hour prior to the Mass. Inurnment will follow at Mount Calvary Cemetery.

In lieu of flowers, the family suggests memorial contributions be made to Sacred Heart Church in Belize, sent in care of Kevin Brennan Family Funeral Home, 2801 SW Urish Rd, Topeka, KS 66614. A new parish hall, to be used for adult education and parish gatherings, is planned in Deacon Don's memory in Belize. The memorial contributions will be used for this purpose.

“ Dear Kostecki Family,

Words seem terribly inadequate to express my condolences at this time. I was unaware of Don's death until Saturday afternoon (April 9) when I saw his obituary while attending a class at the Mount in Atchison. I am so very, very sorry.

Don and I were classmates in the Loyola program, while he was studying for his diaconate. So, every Monday night, for three years, we were together in class, learning with our colleagues, discussing theology. Don was a remarkable student. His insight and absolute passion for ministry were very evident. He often spoke of his work in the parish, and with the business men's group that met and prayed together often.

Don also told us about his family. He loved each of you so very much. Nettie was the love of his life, and he was looking forward to those "quieter" years in Belize after she retired, when he would be active as a Deacon.

Don's goal to be ordained a Deacon was ever present in his conversations. I still have the invitation he sent to his ordination. It is a blessing that he was able to be ordained and know the joy of that Sacrament.

The last time I saw Don was at the dedication of the pipe organ at St. Benedict's Abbey Church. He was smiling and animated, and spoke of looking forward to his ordination. We talked and laughed as we walked together into the Abbey Church...one of the many "Houses of God" with which Don was very familiar.

And so it is now that he is in that everlasting "House of God."
