Donald M. Snook, 93, Topeka, Kansas passed away Tuesday, October 6, 2020.

Don was born March 16, 1927, in Topeka to Clarence and Annie Douglas Snook. Don was drafted into the Army on June 5, 1945. The war with Germany was over in May and over with Japan in July of that year. Don served in Italy as an orderly and then hospital registrar and was honorably discharged with the rank of Staff Sergeant.

On October 22, 1960, Don and Veronica Fallon were united in marriage at Most Pure Heart of Mary Church. They enjoyed 54 years together until her death August 7, 2015.

Don was a member of Most Pure Heart of Mary Church and the Knights of Columbus. Don was a plumber retiring from USD 501. He was a member of the Plumbers and Pipefitters Local #441 and the VFW Post 1650. He enjoyed playing softball, woodworking, traveling and dancing. He and Veronica danced Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights.
