Dorothy M. Sheehan, passed away Wednesday, February 22, 2006 at her home in Topeka, KS. She was born August 25, 1918 in St. Louis, MO, the daughter of Joseph and Mary Lakinger.

Dorothy was preceded in death by her husband, James M. Sheehan, whom she married October 9, 1941, in St. Louis, MO. James died December 8, 1999. Also preceding her passing was an infant son, Edward, and daughter Alice Moser.
