Edward Franklin Custenborder, 82, Topeka, Kansas, passed away January 28, 2019.

Ed was born on November 13, 1936, in Topeka, the son of Franklin and Rose Donnelly Custenborder. He graduated from Hayden Catholic High School in 1954. Ed was married to Mary Judith Slaybaugh; she preceded him in death on November 6, 2018. Ed and Judy were the owners of Ed's Florist Shop in North Topeka.
