July 7, 1908 - October 25, 2009

Mrs. Eva Marie Gerner (nee Dumelle), 101, Topeka, entered into eternal peace Thursday morning, October 22, 2009, while sleeping. She was born, July 7, 1908 in Austria-Hungary (Glogowatz, Hungary; today's Vladimirescu, Romania), the daughter of Joseph and Anna Reiss Dumell. Her mother brought her to the United States at age four months. She was raised and lived in College Point NY from 1908 to 1965. Her employment was primarily as a factory worker, seamstress, telephone operator and housekeeper. On May 5, 1925, Eva and Peter Gerner were married. Upon his retirement in 1965, they moved to Venice FL. While in Venice, Eva volunteered at her church and participated in parish prayer groups. Her hobby had been word puzzles. In 2004, Mrs. Gerner moved to Topeka to be close to her only survivors, her son and daughter-in-law, Francis and Yoshi Gerner. She was preceded in death by Peter, her husband; her mother, Anna Dumell; and sister, Anna R. Dumell. A parish rosary will be prayed at 6 p.m. Sunday at Kevin Brennan Family Funeral Home, 2801 SW Urish Rd, Topeka KS 66614, where visitation will follow until 8 p.m. Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Monday at Most Pure Heart of Mary Church.
