



Gareth "Gary" Saville

September 18, 1942 - March 14, 2024

Gareth "Gary" Lamont Saville, 81, of Topeka, KS, passed away at home on Thursday, March 14, 2024. He was born on September 18, 1942, in Marysville, Kansas to Thomas Saville and Beatrice (Livingston) Saville, the third of four children. He graduated from Marysville High School in 1960 and attended Emporia State University for one year.

On August 8, 1964, Gary married Pat Kramer at St. Gregory Catholic Church in Marysville. They then made their home in Topeka. They were blessed with two daughters, Kelley LaRae and Nicole Christine.

Gary enlisted in the Kansas National Guard in 1963. He was called to active duty in 1969 and served in the US Army as a Staff Sergeant in Vietnam. He received the Bronze Star, the Vietnam Service Medal, and National Defense and Campaign Medals. After his military service, Gary joined the American Legion. In 2019, he fulfilled his wish to go on an Honor Flight to Washington, D.C. to celebrate his service to his country, accompanied by his son-in-law, Rick.

He graduated from Washburn University in 1973 with a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting and a minor in Psychology. He was a member of the business fraternity, Delta Sigma Pi. His work experience began at General Electric Supply, then Santa Fe Railroad, Kencraft, and Hazlett Oil. He retired after 13

years as Comptroller for the Kansas Lottery. He was a member of St. Matthew Catholic Church for over 30 years, and after moving, attended Christ the King Catholic Church.

As a child, Gary was in Boys Scouts, loved football, acted in high school plays, was a class officer, and on the golf team. He was an excellent dancer and, while dating, taught Pat how to Jitterbug. They usually danced every dance and were among the very best! For the rest of their dancing days, it was serious business.

Gary loved his family first. He was his sister's protector and best friends with his brother and brother-in-law. He loved hunting with his dad, playing many rounds of golf with the men in his family, fishing with his grandson, making pancakes for his granddaughters, and being with his friends. He taught his daughters to play sports, to ride a bike, drive a car, and attended their many games, piano and dance recitals, choir concerts and cheerleading at games. He did the same for his six grandkids – they were the joy of his life.

He enjoyed road trips with his siblings and their families to Colorado and Yellowstone. While driving, they communicated by CB radio and his handle was Straight Arrow, which described him to a tee. Gary was a man of great integrity, manners, was respectful, and very methodical in his actions. He was a great speller, had a beautiful singing voice, and his wit was one of a kind. All who knew him say he was “one of the good guys.” He was loved by so many and will be deeply missed by family and friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents Thomas and Beatrice Saville and his brother Darrell Saville.

Gary is survived by his wife Pat of almost 60 years, daughters Kelley Smith (Rick) of Manhattan, and Nicole Oliver (Joel) of Topeka, along with

grandchildren Carly, Kendall and Mallory Smith, and Morgan, Ainslee and Jonah Oliver. He is also survived by his brother Errol Saville (Mary) of Topeka and his sister Gail Lange (Denny) from Mequon, Wisconsin, brothers and sisters-in-law, numerous nieces and nephews, and friends.

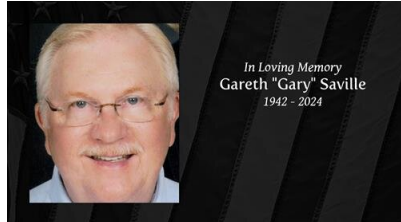
