Gary Earl Weidenbach, 63, Topeka, died Sat., Nov. 19, 2005.

Gary was born Aug. 28, 1942 in Angleton TX, the son of Boyce and Helen Couchman Weidenbach. He graduated from Topeka High School and Washburn University, earning a BBA. On May 28, 1966, Gary and Mary Lou Blinzler were married in Pierce City MO. She survives at the home.

Gary retired in 1995 from the State of Kansas with 34 years of service as an accountant with SRS and with the Dept. on Aging. In 1999 he joined his daughter-in-law, Susan Weidenbach, as a partner of FUTUREdge, Inc. Gary was a member of Holy Name Catholic Church where he served on the Pastoral Council, was a member of Catholic Charities Advisory Council, and a board member of Credit Union One. He was a youth baseball coach for many years. Gary was a kind and caring husband, father, grandpa and friend.

Other survivors include, his sons, Paul Weidenbach ,and his wife, Susan, and their daughters Madison and Mesa, Topeka, and Christopher Weidenbach, and his wife, Shelly, Oakland CA; his father, Boyce Weidenbach, Topeka; brothers, Doug Weidenbach, Flippin AR, and Kenny Weidenbach, Tulsa OK; and two step-brothers, Jack and Jerry Metz. He was preceded in death by his mother in 1967, and his stepfather, Charles Metz, in 1985.
