



Gaylen Rodgers

April 23, 1935 - May 9, 2025

Gaylen Max Rodgers, 90, Topeka, Kansas, passed away on Friday, May 9, 2025.

Gaylen was born in Healey, Kansas, the son of Lowell and Beulah Rodgers. He graduated from McPherson High School in 1953. Gaylen attended Wichita State University on a basketball scholarship in 1953-54 and earned a Bachelor of Education from McPherson College in 1958. He married Mary Mathes in McPherson on May 26, 1956; she preceded him in death in 2017. Gaylen taught in Yates Center, Kansas for 15 years, during this time he was the head coach for boys' basketball and taught industrial arts and drivers ed. Gaylen worked at the McPherson Refinery for 19 years until he retired in 1998. After Mary's retirement in 2001, they enjoyed travelling to all 50 states and 37 countries.

Gaylen's main interest was sports, and he participated in basketball and track throughout his school years. He was named All State at McPherson High School in basketball and played at Wichita State and McPherson College, where he was named Small College All American. After that, his love of basketball led him to coaching at Roxbury High School and Yates Center High School. Gaylen was inducted into the McPherson High School Wall of Fame in 2000, honoring him for the many accomplishments in high school basketball. He was an avid fan of the Jayhawks, Royals, and Chiefs. He watched all their

games, even during the not-too-successful years.

Gaylen loved being with his grandchildren, feeding the fish, teaching them to ride a bike, going fishing, watching them play sports and allowing them to drive the golf cart.

Gaylen was a member of the Optimist Club, Lions Club, the Elks, KNEA, OCAW Local 5-558 of McPherson, and Turkey Creek Golf Club. He was a lifetime member of the McPherson First United Methodist Church and booster clubs for McPherson High School and McPherson College. He loved playing golf with his buddies. He spent many mornings at the McPherson Senior Center drinking coffee, playing dominoes or pool and was a member of their travelling pool team.

Gaylen always had a puzzle to work on. In his younger days, he enjoyed helping his father-in-law work on the farm, helping with training horses, and hunting quail, pheasant, and prairie chicken with his dogs.

Gaylen is survived by his children, Lori Spain (John) of Topeka and Julie Brehm (Randy) of Eatonton, Georgia; grandchildren, Christopher Spain (Clare) of Prairie Village, Kansas, Mackenzie Brehm of Atlanta, Georgia, Carter Brehm (Juliana) of Atlanta, and Benjamin Spain (Alison) of Topeka; great-grandchildren, Jade and Philomena Spain; and his sister, Carole Navrat of Hillsboro, Kansas. He was also preceded in death by his parents, sister, Twilla Spiller, and brother, Leland Rodgers.

Funeral service will be 11 a.m. Wednesday, May 14, 2025, at McPherson First United Methodist Church, 1200 E Kansas Ave, McPherson KS 67460. Burial will follow in McPherson Cemetery.

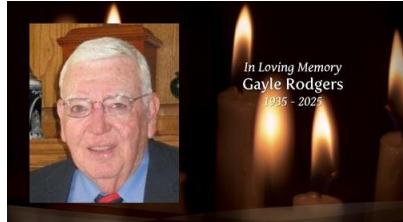
