Live simply – Laugh often – Love deeply.... this script is written above the front door of our home and describes very accurately the core of my husband, Glenn W. "Bill" Bowen II. Bill passed peacefully into heaven Thursday, October 21, 2021.

Large in size, large in humor, large in generosity and large in tender love...Bill was loved by his family from the day he was born, November 22, 1951, in Quincy IL. That family love includes his parents (the late) Glenn and Luella Bowen, brothers Terry Bowen (Beth), Albany IL and Mitch Bowen (Vicki), Overland Park KS; nieces, Tara Read (Dave), Kara Brownrigg (Tanner); and nephews, Tony Bowen (Jen) and Bradley Bowen (Elise); as well as eight great-nieces and great-nephews.

Bill was loved by my family the first time they met, nearly 50 years ago. Those loves include (the late) John and Sarah Jones, Cathy Jones (late, Ron), nephew Matt Jones (Kim) and their daughters Cameron and Kara all of Huntsville AL; one deceased niece, Alison Breaux (Tommy); Sandy Jones Brooks (Don) Elgin SC, and nephew Jonathan Brooks (Mary) of North Falmouth MA.

Bill was blessed by the love of many friends, who became family...especially (the late) Syl and Betty Herman and their daughters, Stephanie Schmitz and

Whether spending time on the Mississippi River, cheering on his beloved Cubbies and KC Chiefs, riding his Harley, playing with and hugging his adoring pups, skiing in Keystone, walking the beaches in Florida, or just working on a good physical challenge, he made it all fun!

Bill's academic background included a BA in Science, from Millikin University, Decatur IL and an MS in Chemistry from Xavier University, Cincinnati OH. He was employed by the BNSF Railway 35 years, retiring in 2011.

“ Mrs. Bowen,

I would like to offer you my condolences to you on the loss of your husband.

You may not recall me, but we meet years ago at one or two of the LMOA meetings in Chicago. I consider Glenn one of my close dear friends and I would like to tell a few brief stories of the memories I have of Glenn outside the committee work and the papers we co-authored. Glenn retired from the BN/SF the same year I retired from GE.

At the meetings Glenn and I would often do a few things without the other committee members. Before his knees gave out we would take time out at the LMOA meetings to go for a nice 3, 4, or 5 mile run along the lake front and just talk about family, sports or whatever came up. Sometimes Glenn asked to meet at 6:30 AM in the Hilton hotel lobby to walk several miles to a place he liked in Chicago for breakfast. Again we would talk about a variety of things and sometime we even got in a few discussions on locomotives.

One of the meetings was in Naperville and we went for a run. Only a few miles into the run I twisted my ankle only to find out when I got back home it was broken. I should have listened to Glenn; he wanted me to have it X-ray there. That night the group went out for a group dinner and I stayed in and ordered room service. Glenn did not forget his running buddy. He had a beer sent to my room to help with the pain.

Another memory was of the LMOA FL&E committee meeting in Salt Lake City. It was scheduled to start Monday morning. Well Glenn called me up and asked if I could arrive Friday night and we could go skiing Saturday and Sunday. Well I told Glenn I do not know how to ski. That did not deter Glenn. His response was you mean you live in Erie PA and with all the snow you get there you do not ski. He offered to pick me up at the airport and be my chauffeur for the

weekend. I still declined and insisted that I do not ski. He said you did not ski and he talked you into taking four of ski lessons and I could do the same. Well with that additional arm twisting I agreed. It was a lot of fun, but I do not like heights and did not like going up the mountain on the ski lift. Glenn had a big laugh at my fear of the lift and the steep slopes. At the end of the day at Snow Bird Glenn did state the downhill slopes at Snow Bird were far more challenge than at other resorts, so Sunday we went to Park City ski slopes.

I could go on about the many good times we had outside the business part of the meeting, Glenn was a good friend!
