Harold "Bud" Holzhuter, 78, Topeka, passed away unexpectedly Sunday, October 12, 2014, at his home. Bud was born January 20, 1936, in Topeka, the son of Joseph and Frances Krentz Holzhuter. He was a 1954 graduate of Hayden High School and spent 14 years in service to our country in the National Guard. He had a 35 year career with Santa Fe Railroad as an accounting manager. On August 13, 1988, Bud and Margaret Harper Talley were united in marriage, enjoying over 26 years together. He was a member of Mother Teresa of Calcutta Catholic Church and the Knights of Columbus, Council No. 534. He was on the Board of Directors of Papan's Landing Senior Center, the Hickory Ridge Homeowners Association and served for two years as Treasurer on the Soldier Township Board. Bud volunteered for Let's Help and the Topeka Rescue Mission. He was a wonderfully skilled woodworker, thoroughly enjoyed fishing and was an avid Jayhawk Basketball fan. For many years Bud had a large vegetable garden, bringing plentiful produce to the Topeka Farmer's Market. Bud was well known and loved and will be dearly missed.
