Harvey James Chebo, 80, passed from this earth on Tuesday, May 7, 2024, in Topeka, Kansas.

Harvey was born October 9, 1943, to Edward and Adeline (Lopajko) Chebo in Chicago, Illinois.

He graduated from St. Philip Basilica High School on June 4, 1961. After graduating, Harvey joined the Air Force, which brought him to Topeka where he worked on Atlas missiles until his service ended in 1966. Harvey worked at IBM for 30 years from 1966 to 1996, where he held positions including Internetworking Specialist and Advisory Systems Engineer. After leaving IBM, he continued his work in technology with companies including Centron, El Camino Real, and Midwest Technology Services. Harvey last worked for Meridian IT as a Solutions Architect for Networking, Power Systems and Storage before retiring in July of 2020.

Harvey was passionate about helping others and his dedication to numerous community programs made a profound impact within the community. A survivor of colon cancer, he volunteered with the American Cancer Society, serving as an advocate for early cancer screenings. Harvey was a youth soccer coach for over 10 years, and in 2007 he began volunteering as a basketball referee in the Upward Bound Sports program at First Baptist

Church. Harvey also volunteered his time to the Topeka Zoo, where he played an important part in with the sharing the zoo's ongoing education and conservation efforts community. Finally, Harvey served as part of the Community Emergency Response Team., where he was trained to assist with disaster preparedness in the community. Harvey's contributions touched the community in ways that will always be remembered.

Harvey was a kind and giving man who was fiercely protective of his children and his cat, Toby. He loved nature and enjoyed the beauty and relaxation that hiking brought to him. Harvey enjoyed spending time with others, and his curiosity and compassion contributed to a constant desire to advance his knowledge about the world around him.

Harvey is survived by his daughter, Valorie Bradley; and son, Kevin Chebo. He is preceded in death by his parents.

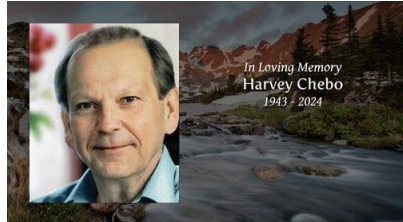
