Harvey L. Latshaw, 84, a lifelong Topeka resident, died April 3, 2006. Son of Albert W. Smith & Sarah A. Latshaw. Attended Belvoir Grade School and graduated Washburn Rural High School.

Mr. Latshaw worked 44 years as a skilled journeyman machinist for the Santa Fe Railway.
