



## Herbert Hoover

June 25, 1920 - January 1, 2005

Herbert H. Hoover, 84, Topeka, died January 1, 2005, at Midland Hospice House from Parkinson's disease.

He was born June 25, 1920 in Olathe to William and Lou Durflinger Hoover. He graduated from Olathe High School and received a bachelor's degree in business administration from Washburn University.

He served in the United States Army during World War II in Europe, earning the Bronze Star.

Mr. Hoover was formerly a co-owner of the Palace Clothing Co. and served as Secretary of the Palace Corporation and manager of the Topeka store. He later was associated with Ray Beers Clothing Co. He was a member and served on the board of directors of the Topeka Chamber of Commerce and also served as president of Downtown Topeka, Inc. He was a member of Phi Delta Theta fraternity, Washburn Alumna Association, the Knights of Columbus and Most Pure Heart of Mary Church.

He married Margaret A. Mulloy on November 27, 1946. She survives. Other survivors include two daughters, Ann L. Hoover and Mary S. Hoover, both of Topeka.

Mr. Hoover was cremated. His family will greet friends from 6:30 to 8:00 Monday at Kevin Brennan Family Funeral Home, 2801 SW Urish Road, where a parish rosary will be prayed at 7 p.m. Mass of Resurrection will be celebrated at 1:30 Tuesday at Most Pure Heart of Mary Church. Inurnment will be private at Mt. Calvary Cemetery.
