Hubert Augustine Slusser, 81, Topeka, passed away Friday, February 10, 2012, at Colmery-O'Neil V.A. Medical Center. Hubert was born November 27, 1930, the son of Thomas F. and Nellie I. Slusser. He was born on the family farm at rural Auburn and was raised there until he joined the Army, and served his country stationed in Germany during the Korean War Conflict, 1955-1957. Upon his return from Germany, he returned to the Topeka area and remained there the rest of his life. He was a Union concrete finisher by trade for over 35 years, having worked for several different contractors in the Topeka area. He married Opal J. Seastom on April 19, 1958, they later divorced. To their union four children were born, Vickie, Connie, Frank, and Debbie. Hubert was an avid KU football and basketball fan. He was a member of the American Legion Post #400 and the VFW in Topeka. He lived by himself in a quiet neighborhood, in Topeka, and after retirement was still an early riser and would go for walks and toss the elderly neighbor folks' papers up on their doorsteps for them. In his later years he remained active along with his older brother Tom; they were affectionately called the Bobbsey Twins. As they were almost inseparable, wherever you found one, the other was not far away. They spent many hours together gardening, fishing, and the like. It was almost as if they were boys back on the farm together. He will be sadly, deeply, and forever missed. He was preceded in Death by his parents, and sisters Rita K. Slusser, Mary R.
