James Edward Parry, age 90, of Topeka, died July 28, 2010 at Midland Hospice House. Jim was born Nov. 1, 1919 in St. Joe, Missouri, to Charles and Frances Collins Parry. He graduated from Hayden and the University of Kansas. Jim served honorably in the Army during WWII touring Normandy, Belgium & Germany and he was recalled for service during the Korean War serving at the Pentagon for two years. Jim married Rosemary Flynn June 1, 1946. She survives. He was preceded in death by his sister Ruth Alexander. After retiring in 1979 from SWB as an Electrical Engineer for 43 years, Jim & Rosemary moved to Beaver Lake AR moving back to Topeka in 1997.
