John Robert "Bob" Jung, 76, Topeka, died Thursday, Oct. 13, 2005 at his home.

He was born Jan. 6, 1929 in Cincinnati, Ohio the son of Adam and Elizabeth Nieszal Jung. He was educated at St. Agnes Grade School, St. Xavier High School and Xavier University, all in Cincinnati. He served in the US Army from 1951 to 1952 during the Korean War and participated in four atomic bomb tests at Camp Desert Rock Nevada in the spring of 1952. This included the first A-Bomb tests involving US ground troops. He married Jane A Schneider in Nov. 1951. They were divorced in July 1990. He worked for Western-Southern Life Ins. Co. for 31 years as an agent, asst. sales manager and district sales manager before retiring in 1990. He was a member of Most Pure Heart of Mary Church since 1968 and an active member of Alcoholics Anonymous for 44 years, since 1960.

Mr. Jung is survived by four children, Steven R. Jung, Lincoln NE, Diane E. Purcell (Michael), Topeka, Mary P. Tetuan (Joe), Topeka, and Ken Jung (Barbara), Topeka; a sister, Ann E. Smith, Cincinnati OH; and grandchildren, Tim Jung, Jill Roth, Adam Jung, Elizabeth Purcell, Joe Purcell, Katie Tetuan, Mitchell Tetuan, Jim Jung, Jessica Jung, Dan Jung and seven great-

grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents and a brother, Joseph F. Jung all of Cincinnati.

Mr. Jung will lie in state from 3 to 6 p.m. Sunday at Kevin Brennan Family Funeral Home, 2801 SW Urish Road, Topeka KS 66614 where a parish rosary will be prayed at 6 p.m. Mass of Resurrection will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Monday at Most Pure Heart of Mary Church. Cremation will follow. Inurnment will be private.
