Judith Kay Ghio, 82, Topeka, Kansas, passed away Tuesday, January 16, 2024.

Judi was born May 27, 1941, in Bismark, North Dakota, to Louie and Gertrude “Fern” Manderino. The family moved to Topeka when Judi was a sophomore and she graduated from Topeka High School in 1959. She went to work for the Santa Fe Railroad and retired from there with 37 years of service.
