



Julie Caton Spencer

December 18, 1948 - December 23, 2021

Julie Ann Caton Spencer, age 73, died unexpectedly of natural causes, at her home, December 23, 2021. She was born December 18, 1948, in Topeka to Russell W. Caton and Eunice T. Westerman Caton. She was a 1966 graduate of Hayden High School and received a degree in nursing from Stormont Vail School of Nursing in Topeka in 1971. Later she earned a masters degree in nursing from Ottawa University. In 1976 she married Darwin (Butch) Spencer. He preceded her in death in 2000.

Julie spent her entire career in nursing in Topeka, first working at Stormont Vail Hospital and then Saint Francis Hospital for several years at both hospitals, mainly in the surgery department. During her tenure at Stormont Vail, she frequently visited the pediatric ward and represented the hospital at outreach functions as Snorky the giant pink mouse mascot. She also taught continuing education classes to other nurses. Most recently she worked in Dr. Iliff's office and at Minor Med. Her hobbies and passion were genealogy and going to garage sales buying glass collectables.

Julie was preceded in death by her parents, husband and two infant brothers, John Joseph in 1954 and Joseph Gerald in 1956. She leaves behind four siblings: Jim Caton (Alice) of Rossville; Mary Lou Sherman (Steve) of Lyndon; Bill Caton (Peggy) of Auburn and Katie Caton of Olathe; and numerous nieces, nephews, great-nieces, great-nephews and countless friends. She

loved her long list of canine companions, past and present, and left behind her buddy Jake.

Julie was a compassionate caregiver and spent her whole life caring for patients and people. She was selfless and always put other people first.

Julie was cremated.

Julie's Memorial Service will be 11 a.m. Saturday, April 2, 2022, at Kevin Brennan Family Funeral Home, 2801 SW Urish Road, Topeka KS 66614. Prior to her service, the rosary will be prayed at 10:15 and family will greet friends from 10:30 until 11 a.m. at the funeral home. Attendees are encouraged to dress casually and wear their favorite sports team's apparel.
