Larry Michael Cowger, 58, of Parker Co, formerly of Topeka passed away in Topeka on Wednesday, September 25, 2013.

Larry got his undergraduate degree from Washburn University in Topeka and his doctorate from the University of Denver School of Law in Denver CO.
