Leland "Lee" Bach, 92, of Overbrook, KS passed away Saturday, Oct. 27, 2012 in Topeka KS. He was born October 14, 1920 in Dwight, KS to Walter and Belle Bach. Lee graduated from Dwight High School and Joined the Navy in Oct. 1940. He served on Carriers Wasp, Boxer and Bennington during WWII. He was stationed 7 years in Paris, France in the U.S. Embassy. After a 20 year retirement from the U.S. Navy he was in charge of Offutt Security Police at Offutt Air Base in Omaha, NE until he retired in 1974. He was also a Master Locksmith. Lee was a member of the Dwight Methodist Church, American Legion, Boxer Org., and the Orient Lodge No. 51 of Topeka. He married Carleen "Carla" Bach in Kansas City, KS. She survives. Survivors include his wife, Carleen Bach; two daughters, Eula Lee (Harold) Fuller and Connie Marie Horne; grandchildren, Angela Horne, Deborah (Allan) Coon, Christine Jonker, Stephen Fuller, Sean (Amanda) Fuller and Laura (Robb) Popp; 4 great-grandchildren and 2 great-great-grandchildren; brother, Robert Bach; nephews, Bob (Debbie) Bach, Glenn (Lisa) Bach; nieces, Sandra (Dennis) Fountaine and Susan Johnson; and numerous nieces and nephews.
