Lidwina Clara Wittman, 99, Topeka, passed away Friday, Nov. 11, 2011. Lidwina was born Sept. 19, 1912 in Morland KS, two and one half miles south of St. Peter, the daughter of Andrew and Clara Knoll Schreiner. In 1928 she moved with her family to Topeka, where on April 25, 1933, she and Wendelin Wittman were married in the Assumption Church. They enjoyed over 57 years together. He preceded her in death on Dec. 28, 1990. Lidwina was a member of Most Pure Heart of Mary Church and a 75 year member of the Daughters of Isabella. She was elected Regent and served three terms from 1968 to 1971. Survivors include her children, Marilyn Bennett (Bill), Lincoln NE, Jerry Wittman (Linda), Elmer Wittman and Wayne Wittman all of Topeka; 11 grandchildren, 20 great-grandchildren, and 8 great-great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by a granddaughter and a great-grandson.
