Linnea Elizabeth Domnanish, 89, passed away on June 5, 2011. She was born on June 12, 1921 in Kansas City KS the daughter of Swedish immigrant parents, August Emil Falstrom and Amelia Caroline (Anderson) Falstrom. Linnea and Edward were married for 55 years before Edward passed away on October 22, 2004.
