Louis Andrew Hidalgo III, 39, formerly of Topeka, passed away Wednesday, November 16, 2016, due to injuries from an automobile accident in Dallas, Oregon.

Louis was born March 9, 1977, in Topeka, the son of Louis, Jr. and Nicki Rocha Hidalgo. He attended Assumption Grade School and was a 1995 graduate of Topeka High School. He was a table games floor supervisor at Spirit Mountain Casino in Grand Ronde, Oregon.

Louis was a member of the American Pool Players Association and played softball for years. He was passionate about his favorite teams, the Kansas City Royals, Chiefs and KU basketball. He loved life and lived it fully. Louis enjoyed travel. He was the “karaoke king” especially performing songs by Prince. Throughout his entire life Louis had a connection to and a love for older people. It was a mutual attraction. But first and foremost, Louis loved his children, his parents, brothers and sisters, nieces and nephews; family was the most important part of his life. He is deeply loved and will be dearly missed.

Grateful to have shared Louis’ life are his children, Miguel, Amalia, Alayna, Alisia and Aneesa Hidalgo; his parents, Louis and Nicki Hidalgo; his siblings, Anthony, Mark, Therese, Javier, Ana and Michael Hidalgo; and his

grandmother, Beatrice Rocha. Louis was preceded in death by an infant brother, Martin Joseph Hidalgo.

Family will greet friends from 4:30 until 6:30 p.m. Tuesday at Mater Dei Assumption Church, 8th and Jackson, Topeka KS, where a rosary will be prayed at 6:30 p.m.

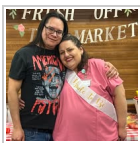

“ What can I say about a guy who had a heart of gold, was a great father, and was so dag gone funny!? I'm so so very sad that the world lost Louie Hidalgo. He was one of my very good friends; we first met in 1993 at this summer camp that took place on the college campus of Kansas in Lawrence. I was a slightly dorky awkward kid, and Louie was suave ladies man! We were there to "learn" about engineering...but we were 10th/11 graders and it was summer so we learned mostly about having fun and being away from home and the parents. We connected because I thought he was so cool and funny, and I could actually make him laugh pretty hard too so we would just be cracking each other up the entire summer camp so much so that I'd be in tears. Both he and I were big into baseball which was another big bonding point and I had actually brought my glove down just on the off chance someone else liked baseball as much as I did. Well Louie did love baseball and we threw the baseball around a few times that summer, he actually had a pretty strong arm. After camp we stayed in touch and wrote a few letters to one another....yes this was before internet so you would actually have to sit down and put a pen to paper then fold it up and stick it in an envelope. He would keep me abreast of what the other fellow campers were up to (I was one of the only kids from another state) we lost touch for a year or two then out of the blue we reconnected in '96 or '97...and he learned that I eventually wound up going to school in Texas; I remember being so excited to reconnect that I started making a habit to go visit him on my drives between Texas and Minnesota. Louie would show me all the cool spots to go to in Topeka and we would never fail throw the baseball around. I also learned that he met a great woman who had tamed the beast that was Louie; and I had the privilege to go to Louie and Marissa's wedding. I also got to spend lots of time with his (at the time) little baby toddler Miguel. Those days were fond memories and Louie always had something witty to say if I said something that set him up for a joke. We also shared some of the same taste in music and he'd keep me on the pulse of new songs / jams. We lost touch for a bit again after I got out of college, but luckily with modern day technology we reconnected at the beginning of this decade again.

As of four years ago I had a total of 4 children and he has 5, 9 between the both of us, so we had some levity over the about how proud of our kids we were and why we had so many of them! He also had some good words for me back in 2012-2013 because I was divorcing and I was uncertain about my future relationship with my own kids; he reassured me that everything would eventually be fine. He was a positive guy and could always take a presumed negative and turn it around. I remember he surprised me one day and said that he gets social anxiety sometimes, I was floored, but he told me that he works through it. Louie was a hero of mine, a guy who really followed his own path and touched people along the way. He was a sensitive guy too and loving father; and I know that he cared about the people in his life. I remember joking with him saying that I'd probably not make it out to see him in Oregon, and could he come at least within 500 miles of Minnesota so that I could visit with him again. I lost my brother in 2010, who died in Oregon....now Louis, who was like a brother, this year also in Oregon. I'm stunned and just shocked. Destroyed actually. I hope Louie can find my brother on the other side, I think they'd get along pretty well; they both liked to give me a hard time. Just last week I had posted a picture on my Facebook page wherein I had a clean suit and tie on and was sitting at a desk and he accused me of renting an office and throwing on a suit for a photo shoot! He was kind of right actually! Louie, I love you and I miss you already buddy. Thanks for being you
