



## Margot L. Krumel

March 8, 1916 - March 25, 2009

Margot L. Krumel, 93, Topeka passed away March 20, 2009. Margot was born March 8, 1916 in Youngstown OH the daughter of John Alexander Logan III and Margaret (Powell). During her elementary school years she attended school in North Turow MA and Long Island NY. At the age of 14, Margot and her sister attended boarding school in Lausanne Switzerland for two years. After returning to the United States her family moved to La Jolla CA where she attended The Bishop School. In 1936 she studied art and music at San Francisco School of Fine Arts, where she met her future husband Herbert. Margot married Herbert K. Krumel, October 21, 1938 in Carmel CA, he preceded her in death in April of 1972. Margot was a musician and an artist. She taught private violin and viola lessons for many years. After she could no longer play her viola her art gave her countless hours of pleasure. In October of 2005 she moved to Brewster Place from NW Washington State. Survivors include sons, Karl (Nancy) Krumel, Green Valley AZ, Mark (Abby) Krumel, Santa Rosa CA; daughter, Katharine (Tom) Slattery, Topeka; six grandchildren; 12 great grandchildren; and brother, John A. (Evagene) Logan IV, Mt. Vernon WA. She also was preceded in death by her sister, Edith Magoffin and a brother, Robert Logan.
