Mary Ann Breit, 95 years, passed away peacefully on Saturday, January 11, 2025, at Evergreen Community of Johnson County in Olathe, Kansas. Prior to moving to Evergreen Community, Mary Ann was a life-long resident of Topeka, Kansas.

Mary Ann was born on April 16, 1929, to John and Mary Breit. She attended Hayden High School and worked for the John Morrell plant for two years, followed by 43 years with Mainline Printing, which was formerly General Printing. Mary Ann was dedicated to caring for her parents, especially in their later years. She was a devoted and faithful Catholic servant attending Sacred Heart Catholic Church before joining Most Pure Heart of Mary Catholic Church. Mary Ann had a strong love for family, especially her sister, Theresa Klotzbach (Martin) who preceded her in death.
