November 9, 1919 - October 25, 2011

Mathew J. McGlinn, Jr., 91, Topeka passed away October 20, 2011. Mathew was born November 9, 1919 in Emporia KS the son of Mathew James McGlinn, Sr. and Elizabeth Mae Hoffman McGlinn. He served in the US Army Air Corps during WWII and was a Prisoner of War for nearly a year. Mathew married Lois Batheen Turner on December 9, 1943 in Emporia KS; she preceded him in death in 2007. He was a member of Most Pure Heart of Mary Catholic Church. He was a past member of the American Legion and Knights of Columbus. He also was in the National Guard for several years. Mathew worked as a timekeeper for the Santa Fe Rail Road and retired in 1962. After retiring he began working for Shawnee County for about 20 years.
