January 30, 1921 - November 29, 2012

Mayme D. Weir, Topeka, passed away November 27, 2012, at 91 years of age. Mayme was born in Minneapolis, Minnesota on January 30, 1921, the daughter of George W. and Mayme D. Johnson Merillat. She resided in Topeka since October 1927, and graduated from Topeka High School and MacMurray College for Women in Jacksonville, Illinois. She also received a Masters Degree from Washburn University in Topeka. Mayme married Lester Lee Weir, Jr. of Pleasant Hill, Illinois on June 24, 1942. He preceded her in death on May 12, 2010. Mayme was employed as a rate clerk in Freight Auditing at the Santa Fe Railway offices in Topeka from 1943 to 1945. From 1961 to 1971, she taught at Clay Elementary School, and then worked as an Instructional Specialist for Language Arts in USD 501 until retirement in 1982. Mrs. Weir is survived by sons Mike, of Springfield, Illinois and Scott and daughter-in-law, Katy, of Topeka; two grandsons, Evan (and his wife, Katie) of Madison, Wisconsin and Cameron (and his wife, Jessy) of Maple Grove, Minnesota.
