Nina G. Bond, 90, of Topeka, passed away peacefully Saturday morning October 5, 2013. Nina was born May 14, 1923, in Mountain Lake MN to Gerhard H. and Helen (Sukau) Neufeld. When she was young the family moved to Wolf Point, Montana where Nina graduated from High School.
