Nina M. Mitchell, 103, of Topeka, formerly of Atchison, died Nov. 23, 2012. She was born July 27, 1909, in Pittsburg, KS, the daughter of Fred and Rose Thomas. Nina graduated from Kansas State Teachers College in Pittsburg where she received a B.S. degree in English and was a member of Kappa Delta Pi English honor fraternity. Nina was also a documented descendant of the Mayflower. She married Roy Mitchell in 1933 in Pittsburg. He preceded her in death on August 2, 1978. Nina taught high school language arts classes in several Kansas and Missouri schools and retired from Atchison Public Schools where she served as an elementary librarian. She was active in the Atchison Methodist church and University Methodist Church in Topeka where she taught adult Sunday school classes for many years. She is survived by two sons, Rome (Jean) Mitchell, Topeka, Hugh (Kay) Mitchell, Wakarusa, KS; grandchildren, Jill Langan, Jane (Troy) Fowler, Gail (Dan) Smith, Blake Mitchell and seven great-grandchildren.
