Patrick James McInerney, 82, passed away Fri., April 13, 2007 in Topeka. Pat was born in Kansas City, KS on February 3, 1925, the son of Peter and Margaret Wall McInerney. He married the love of his life, his Irish rose, Margaret "Peggy" O'Shea on September 8, 1951 in KC, MO. She preceded him in death on Oct. 10, 2000. Pat was a member of Most Pure Heart of Mary Catholic Church, where he had served on Parish Council, St. Patrick's Day Parade Committee, and was a former member of the VFW. He served in the 5th division of the US Army during WWII and was awarded a Purple Heart while serving in the Battle of the Bulge. He owned and operated McInerney Marble and Tile.
