



Quinlan Halbeisen

July 30, 1928 - January 21, 2020

Charles Quinlan Halbeisen, 91, Topeka, Kansas, passed away Tuesday, January 21, 2020.

Quinlan was born July 30, 1928, in Litchfield, Nebraska, to Albert and Myra Quinn Halbeisen. He earned a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from the Illinois Institute of Technology and had a career with Southwestern Bell. On August 24, 1963, Quinlan and Ann Mary Consol were united in marriage in Endicott, New York. She preceded him in death September 27, 2012.

Quinlan was an avid volunteer for the Campfire Girls most of his life, frequently traveling to Boone, Iowa on weekends for electronic and building projects. He was a lifetime member of the Newman Club, a Catholic organization which he joined in college, and Quinlan was a member of Most Pure Heart of Mary Church.

He is survived by his daughter, Mary; brother, Joseph Halbeisen; and niece, Rita Payne. He was also preceded in death by siblings, Frances Lowder, Donald Halbeisen, Louis Halbeisen and Thomas Halbeisen.

at 9:30 followed by Mass of Christian Burial at 10. Burial will be at Mount Calvary Cemetery, Topeka.
