



## Robert J. Reding

February 14, 1918 - May 28, 2006

Robert J. Reding, 88, passed away Sunday, May 28, 2006, in Topeka. He was born on February 14, 1918 in Paxico, Kansas, the third child born to Frank and Abbie Muckenthaler Reding. He attended Paxico schools, graduating in 1937. He was in the National Guard and World War II serving in the European theater in France and Germany. Upon his discharge he farmed in the Paxico area and, in 1962, founded the Cliff-N-Creek Campground (now called the Mill Creek Campground) and operated it until 1984, when he retired.

He was a member of the Sacred Heart Catholic Church and the Paxico Knights of Columbus.

He was married to Kathleen Murray on November 13, 1971. She preceded him in death on January 7, 2000. He loved sports and was an avid reader.

Besides his wife and parents, he was preceded in death by two brothers, Francis Reding and Charles Reding, two sisters, Geraldine Chambers and Mildred Beier, a nephew, Gary Jolly and a niece, Martha Glasscock. Survivors include two sisters, Leola Jolly, Streator, Illinois and Adele Schuetze, Tucson, Arizona, nine nephews and nine nieces.

Mr. Reding will lie in state from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. at Sacred Heart Church in Newbury on Thursday. A rosary will be prayed at 7:30. Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at 10 a.m. on Friday at the church. Burial will follow in

Newbury Cemetery.
