Scott Alan Lewis, 37, Topeka, died Thursday, February 5, 2004, at his home. He was born in Topeka to parents Richard and Janet Michaelis Lewis on January 27, 1967.

Scott was a lifelong Topekan and a graduate of Topeka West High School with the Class of 1986. Mr. Lewis was assistant manager of Tractor Supply Company. He previously worked for Falley's, Leprechaun Lawns and Lawns by Bryce. He was a Mission Township Volunteer Firefighter. Mr. Lewis was an original member of the Topeka Bowhunters Association and a member of Topeka Archery Club. He was a member and past president of Kansas Safe Hunter Association and a hunter safety instructor, a TARC volunteer, and a Topeka Storm Spotter. He was a NASCAR, Kansas City Chiefs, and K-State fan.

Scott and his father enjoyed spending valuable time together with their quadrunners and the great outdoors. He was a caring person with a heart of gold who adored his mother and three sisters. He was preceded in death by his father, September 16, 2003. He is survived by his mother, his sisters, Cheryl Lewis, Shawnee, Debra Baumgartner, Topeka, and Christina Cory, Parkville, MO; and his best friend, his English Pointer, Brave.
