The apt mgr. said it was because I made her look bad when she couldn't collect all the rent on time from all the tenants- Unlike Shirley, the lady who was compassionate. She never regretted helping me and I think God led me to meet her in my time of need as a divorced single mom. May everyone share that kind of heart for people, and see what comes back to you in return from others who will help you. She gave me hope and friendship, and was a kind but sharp apt manager.
