Stanley Norman Hubbard, 61, Topeka, passed away Friday, April 20, 2007. Stan was born January 2, 1946 in Lawrence, the son of Clarence and Juanita Heinrich Hubbard. He graduated from Lawrence High in 1964 and earned his degree in secondary education from the University of Kansas in 1971. Stan served his country in the Army Reserves. On October 17, 1987, Stan and Linda Trueblood Rutschmann were married. They enjoyed almost 20 years together. He was currently a partner in Steel Fixture Manufacturing Company. Prior to that he owned Bid Facilitators and a Leavenworth business, Carpet Square. Stan and Linda were members of Countryside United Methodist Church and a couples golf club. He was a lifelong, avid KU basketball fan and a dog lover. Stan loved doing home improvements and no project was too big or difficult for him to tackle. He even taught a home improvement class. Stan believed in organ donation and donated his corneas. His illness prevented him from other organ donations. Stan was cremated. Survivors include his wife, Linda, of the home; sons, Grady Hubbard and wife, Julie, St. Louis, Joel Hubbard and wife, Lyndsay, Leavenworth; step-daughter, Angela Rutschmann, Topeka; brother, Marv Hubbard, Tampa FL; uncle, Ken Hubbard and wife, Marilyn, Baldwin City; father-in-law, Edwin Trueblood, Norton; and aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces and nephews.
