Tyler William Green, 25, Topeka, Kansas passed away Saturday, September 28, 2024.

Tyler was born to Jim Green and Karyn Oliver on December 23, 1998, in Topeka. Tyler graduated from Hayden Catholic High School in 2018 and from Washburn University Nursing School in 2023. He was a nurse at Stormont Vail Hospital.

Tyler was a shining light in every room he walked into. He was a joy to be around, and he made everyone around him smile. He was the most respectful, generous, gentle, and kind soul. 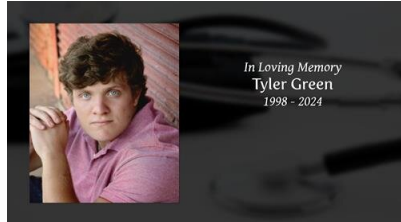

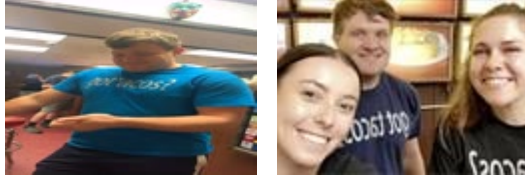
