Virginia Meeker of Topeka passed away January 2, 2016 at Stormont-Vail Hospital. The daughter of J. Stanley and Bernice Ream Hagan, Virginia was born in Wichita, KS on August 10, 1922. Her early years were spent in Emporia. She attended Emporia State University and graduated from the University of Kansas where she was a member of Kappa Alpha Theta.
