Virginia Ann Rundell, 88, Topeka, Kansas, broke the chains of Lewy Body Dementia, freeing her to be joyfully with the Lord, and all those dear ones who went before her, for eternity on Friday, February 20, 2026.

Virginia was born July 25, 1937, to Jacob and Helen Treiber Krentz, in Topeka. She attended Holy Name Grade School, Sacred Heart High School in Wichita and graduated from Hayden Catholic High School in 1954. She married the late Paul Rundell in 1954.

Virginia was employed by Southwestern Bell from 1969 until her retirement in 1996 as manager of operator services. She worked at FHL Bank Topeka for ten years, retiring in 2015. She was a longtime member of Mater Dei Parish, Holy Name Catholic Church, where she filled many roles over the years. Virginia was a Minister of the Eucharist, served on the Finance Council, was chairperson of the parish's main fundraiser, the Fall Bazaar, and helped in various capacities in the church office. Socially, she enjoyed participating in events of the parish Altar Guild.

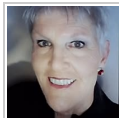
