Wendell J. Nusser, 85, Topeka, passed away Wednesday, November 4, 2015.

Wendell was born October 1, 1930, in Rolla KS to parents, Walter and Anna Hooten Nusser. Graduating from Plevna High School, Wendell married his high school sweetheart, Donna Pieplow, who survives him after 64 years of marriage.

Wendell proudly dedicated 43 years of service to our country in the US Air Force and Kansas Air National Guard. During this time he received many honors including the AF Meritorious Service Medal, National Defense Medal and Small Arms Expert Marksmanship Ribbon.

I remember the cars he rebuilt, the camper he rebuilt and the self-in-house project he oversaw of building a Security Control Center for our Security Forces after we joined SAC.
